




Year 3: French Playground Games: Numbers and Age

In this unit, children were introduced to numbers up to 12 in French. They began by sequencing and matching the numbers, and then thought about how to pronounce the numbers using songs to aid them. They were then able to apply their knowledge to talking about their birthdays. The children then learnt some traditional French playground games and used the numbers they had practiced to play them!





Year 3: In a French classroom


they were masculine or feminine. The children created their own school backpack with all the equipment they might need in their French classroom.





Year 3: A circle of life in French

In this lesson, children used short phrases and images to build sentences about animals and the habitats in which they might be found. They began to learn about positive and negative form, saying where animals do and do not live. Children also learnt about food chains and life cycles and were able to create their own versions in French.





Year 4: Clothes: Getting Dressed



The class learnt about vocabulary to describe different items of clothing. They started by learning the nouns and whether they were masculine or feminine, then learning about plurals. The children talked about what clothing they liked and did not like, then used adjectives of size and colour to describe their outfits.





Year 4: Eurovision Song Contest



In this unit, Eurovision fever took over Year 4! The children learnt the French names for different European countries and located them on a map. They listened to French children talking about what musical instruments they play and what kinds of music they like. The children learnt about

> different types of weather. The children learnt about the water cycle and then created their own French weather forecasts.












Year 5: Space Exploration

Planet 1: Neptune


- 1. Voici Neptune = Here is Neptune

The children in Year 5 learnt about the Solar System in French, learning the names for planets and identifying them as cognates or near-cognates. They read information texts about the planets and constructed factual sentences. Then, they wrote descriptive sentences, using metaphors to compare the planets.

Year 5: Meet My Family



Children were able to talk about and write about their families in French. They looked at words for different family members and created their own family trees. They then discussed what their family members liked and disliked and created a short slide presentation about this!


Year 6: Football Champions
