Re: Safeguarding Day :“Safe, Strong and Supported”

We are pleased to inform you that The Greetland Academy will be holding a Safeguarding Day for all pupils from Reception to Year 6 on Monday 5th January on our return from the Christmas break. The theme for the day is:

“Safe, Strong and Supported: Keeping Ourselves and Others Safe.”

The purpose of the day is to help children understand what safeguarding means, learn how to stay safe in different environments, and know who to turn to if they ever feel worried or unsafe. This aligns with our statutory PSHE, RSHE, and online safety curriculum, and strengthens our ongoing commitment to fostering a culture of trusted adults, open conversations, and kindness.

What the day involves:

- Reception and Key Stage 1: Activities focus on recognising feelings, identifying safe adults, and understanding basic safety rules at home, in school, and in the community.
- Key Stage 2: Activities build independence, digital safety, understanding boundaries and consent, managing risk, and supporting peers. Workshops, role-play, and creative tasks will help pupils apply these skills in practical situations.
- Whole school assemblies led by our ‘Safe Squad’ will highlight key messages and celebrating pupils’ learning.

Why it matters:

Safeguarding is about more than keeping children safe from harm. It also empowers them to make positive choices, support others, and develop resilience. By participating in Safeguarding Day, pupils will:

- Learn to recognise unsafe situations and feelings.
- Know trusted adults they can talk to.
- Understand personal boundaries and how to respect others.
- Gain confidence in staying safe online, at home, in school, and in the wider community.

We encourage you to continue conversations at home about what your child has learned and to reinforce the importance of speaking up when something doesn’t feel right.
