Curriculum Focus

English: This term we will be consolidating skills in the following key areas; grammar, punctuation and spelling. This will include;

- identifying and writing main and / or subordinate clauses
- appropriately using co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions
- using brackets, dashes or commas for parenthesis
- using relative clauses, modal verbs and expanded noun phrases To support this, we will be using the text "The Final Year". We will also be working with the children on their handwriting to ensure correct formation, size and position of letters.

Maths: read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10,000,000; use negative numbers in context, and calculate intervals across zero; solve number and practical problems that involve ordering and comparing numbers to 10,000,000; using negative numbers and calculating intervals across zero.

We will also revisit the formal written methods for Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication & Division.

Art: Photography and Mixed Media.

Computing: Online Safety.

Geography: Where does our energy come from?

MFL: French sport and the Olympics. Music: Dynamics, pitch and texture.

PE: Net and wall games.

PSHCE: How can we keep healthy as we grow?

Science: Living things and their habitats.
